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**ORDER APPROVING ENTRY OF  
FINAL CONSENT DECREE AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

The parties have filed their Joint Motion Requesting Entry of Final Consent Decree and Order of Dismissal. ECF No. 46. The motion is **GRANTED** and the Final Consent Decree and Order of Dismissal is entered as set forth below:

Plaintiff, City Walk – Urban Mission, Inc., and Defendant, Wakulla County, hereby stipulate and agree that this case has been settled and that all issues and controversies have been resolved to their mutual satisfaction and that this matter be dismissed with prejudice except as necessary to enforce the terms of the consent decree as set forth below and in accordance with *Kokkonen v. Guardian Life Insurance Company of America*, 511 U.S. 375, 381-82 (1994). Accordingly,

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

1. The Court has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action under the Religious Land Use & Institutionalized Persons Act, 42 U.S.C. 2000cc et seq. (“RLUIPA”);

2. City Walk, is allowed to continue using 55 Ball Ct., Crawfordville, Florida 32327, as a religious transition home for three to six unrelated adults without further approval or interference from the County;

3. As provided herein, City Walk shall have a right under RLUIPA, 42 U.S.C. § 2000(b)(1) to have its religious transition home treated on equal terms with a community residential home use as that use is defined and treated under Wakulla County’s Land Development Code. The number of religious transition home sites within the County, including 55 Ball Ct., shall not exceed a total of four (4) individual locations with no more than six (6) unrelated adults at each location at any one time. City Walk shall immediately notify Wakulla County when a facility is being established and/or abandoned, which notification will include the location, the number of unrelated adults in residence at that site, and the date of establishment or abandonment; and

4. The County shall rescind the pending notice of repeat violation dated March 4, 2020, against Ms. Ellen Miller, ECF No. 1-5.

The Clerk shall close the file.
